Background

- In 2017, the City of Brighton launched its Sculpture-on-Loan Sculpture Walk program.
- The Sculpture Walk is located at Carmichael Park and is part of the City's Eye for Art Sculpture-on-Loan Program. Following a call for art, artists are selected to display their outdoor sculptures in this yearlong exhibit.
- 2018's Sculpture Walk included five pieces valued at \$46,700.

Background

- Two of the outgoing sculptures, selected as "People's Choice," have been acquired by the City for permanent placement.
- "The Farmer" will be relocated to the Bromley Farm.
- "Star Gazer" will be relocated to Observatory Park.
- A dedication is planned for June.



2019 Sculpture-on-Loan program

- Call for art issued in November 2018 with a Jan. 15 deadline.
- Over 100 sculptures were submitted for review.
- Submissions were reviewed by a selection panel including:
 - Brighton Cultural Arts Commission
 - BCAC public art committee
 - Eye 4 Art committee
 - Brighton High School students
 - City Council representative.




2019 Sculpture-on-Loan program

- Five sculptures were selected. Each will receive a \$500 honorarium at placement and the selected artists will also be competing for up to \$1,000 for winning the People's Choice Award.
- The total value of the five sculptures selected is \$80,200. Cost to the City is \$3,500 (Honorariums and People's Choice Award).


