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Benedict Park History

- Benedict Park is one of Brighton's oldest/mature parks being constructed in the late 1950's
- Officially named "Benedict Park" in 1963 (previously "New City Park") Ray Benedict Sr

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Background:

- Benedict Park is a large 21.83 acre park that is heavily used by the public
- It is a very versatile park comprised of a skate park, splash pad, disc golf course, arboretum, xenic demonstration bed, two playgrounds, walking trails, and two restrooms. It is also heavily used for sports programming




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Scope of Project:

- (2) New playgrounds
- New irrigation design and install
- (3) New shelter structures
- Skate park expansion
- New trail loop connection
- Safety lighting
- Landscaping
- Existing restrooms, disc golf course, splash pad are already established/updated and shall not be part of this project

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Brighton New Irrigation System Design and Installation

Current Irrigation:

- 30+ years old
- Very inefficient and requires a lot of labor to make repairs
- Some zones are unmarked and almost impossible to find
- Difficult to program

Proposed Irrigation:

- New irrigation will be professionally designed for water efficiency
- Water will be from a non-potable source
- New irrigation components will be installed for maximum efficiency and will save staff on labor hours for repairs
- New flow sensors and rain sensors will be installed

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Brighton Other Park Upgrades/Additions

- New trail loop connection on east end of park, west side of ditch
- Safety lighting for walking path and shelters
- ADA compliant trails and connections
- Updated Park signage
- New Trees/landscaping
