Boundary Shift Pros and Cons

- Pros:**
- Good transition to future Ward boundaries
 - Minimizes boundary line 'flip-flopping'
 - Inmate population stays in Ward 1, which reduces the need for large population off-sets in other wards
- Cons:**
- Will require boundary line 'flip-flopping' to offset inmate population when moved into Ward 2 (in the future)
 - Splits neighborhoods into different wards


