Location and Overview







Background/History

- Located: 555 North 11th Avenue
- Built in 2004
- This playground is part of the Recreation Center daycare and summer camp programs
- This playground is more of a residential unit and is outdated





Current Playground







New Playground Features

- ADA Accessible Pour-in-place Surfacing
- Age Inclusive Playground: 2–12-year-old play unit
- Extended footprint to incorporate a swing bay
- Shade structure to help reduce heat
- Commercial grade playground

Budget/Construction Cost

- The solicitation for a new playground was posted in mid December for a total of five weeks, with a not to exceed maximum budget of \$150,000.00, and resulted in a total of four responses
- Star Playgrounds was deemed the most responsive and responsible vendor for the project.
- Sufficient appropriation exists for this project with a total project cost for install of the new playground, extended footprint, and "pour-in-place" surfacing and for \$150,000.00
- Funding Source: Parks and Recreation Capital Projects / "Recreation Center Play Structure" This whole project is being funded by some of the money the City received from the sale of the Denver Broncos

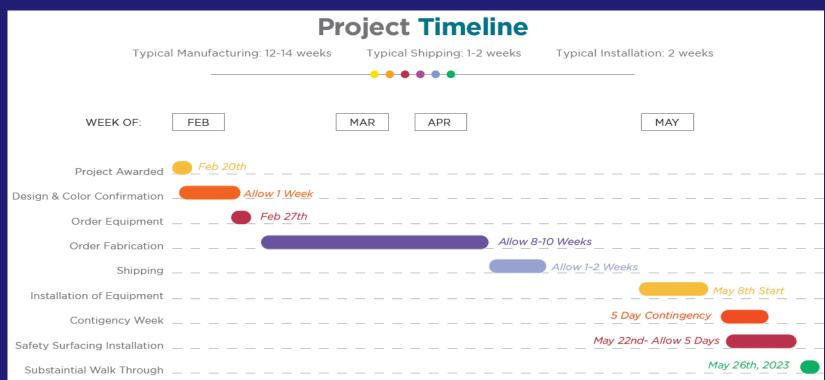

Accept Bid 4, submitted by Just Be You, Inc dba Star Playgrounds, as this Bid has been deemed the lowest most responsive and responsible of those received.

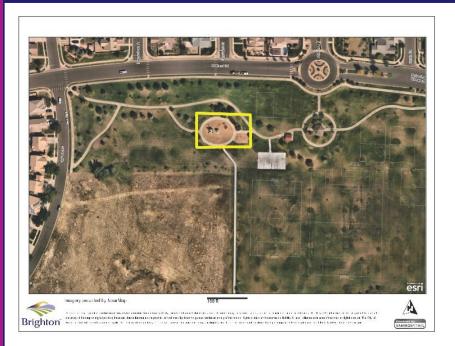


Construction Timeline

Background

- Location: 254 Miller Avenue
- Last original amenity left in the park
- Crack sealed in 2021
- Originally built with an asphalt surfacing
- This sport court is part of the ~6.5 acre park
- This tennis court has deteriorated to an almost unplayable condition and is beyond the point of repair

New Sports Courts

- Post Tension Concrete
- The court will fit into the existing footprint
- The court will be striped and surfaced for tennis use
- New nets
- New fence

- The tennis court solicitation was posted in mid December for four weeks. We received one response.
- Hellas Construction was deemed the most responsive and responsible vendor for the project.
- Sufficient appropriation exists for this project
- Funding Source: Parks and Recreation Capital Projects / "Colorado Park Tennis Courts"

Proposal 1: \$534,000.00

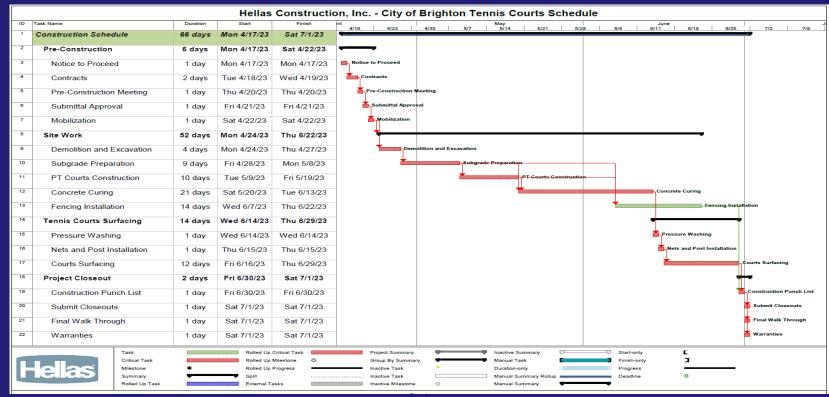


STAFF RECOMMENDATION:
