

# Procurement Summary

#### PROCUREMENT METHOD:

Sourcewell offers an existing, competitively bid, Agreement with Tyler Technologies upon which the City has been authorized to piggyback. Cooperative purchasing is encouraged when feasible and in the best interest of the City under Brighton Municipal Code section 3-8-10.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Accept the quote submitted by Tyler Technologies under the Sourcewell Cooperative Agreement #090320-TTI.





#### **Staff Recommendation**

#### Tyler Technologies Enterprise ERP Software

- Modules include Financials, Utility Billing,
   Timekeeping & Payroll, Procurement, Projects & Grants, Capital Assets, etc.
- Replaces Innoprise, Caselle and Water Smart

#### Why Tyler Technologies?

- Integrated solution
- Specialize in governmental finance (see Colorado Infographic included in packet)
- Have modules and functionality to meet the needs of a government of our size





## What we are planning for

#### City of Brighton Staff

- Finance and Technical staff will spend significant time during implementation
- Admin staff will be recruited as SME's for their departments
- Department users will be recruited to provide feedback throughout the process
- Training for all users will be provided prior to go-live of any module
- New timekeeping software that better meets our needs
- Financial reporting will be more intuitive and accessible real time
- Cloud-based support, including future system updates

#### Residents, Customers and Vendors

- Utility Billing customers can see hour by hour usage and will have a new platform for making payments electronically
- Vendors will be able to receive payments electronically rather than by check
- There will be better options for accepting electronic payments



# Cost analysis

#### Annual Software Cost – Approximately \$215K annually

- Current annual spend on similar software is approximately \$152K
- New system provides increased functionality, support and compliance
- Includes cloud hosted software platform

#### Estimated Implementation Costs (over 2 years)

•	Tyler Technologies support, conversion, etc.	\$700K
•	Project Management Consulting	\$150K
•	Backfill Staff	\$100K
