Background



- ▶ ADCOM was formed by its contracting members in 1974
- ▶ The purpose of ADCOM is to provide emergency service reporting, dispatching, emergency services communication, and coordination
- ▶ Services are provided 24 hours a day, 7 days per week

ADCOM Legal Status

- ▶ ADCOM has a dual legal status as a governmental entity and a non-profit corporation
- ▶ The dual status is cumbersome to administer and creates confusion for third parties as to ADCOM's governmental status
- ▶ Reorganizing ADCOM as a statutory authority will clarify ADCOM's status as a political subdivision of the State of Colorado
- ▶ The issue of ADCOM's status has come up several times when negotiating contracts. ADCOM always wants to include a clause regarding its protections under governmental immunity and some vendors have questioned the legitimacy of such a clause.
- ▶ ADCOM will be able to realize the benefit of having the non-profit corporation restructured to support the authority through donations, grants and other fund raising as a section 501(c)(3) qualified tax-exempt organization.

Options for City Council Consideration



- ▶ Approval of the Intergovernmental Agreement will facilitate ADCOM's transition to a statutory Authority and allow the City of Brighton and the Brighton Police Department to maintain membership in ADCOM.
- ▶ Rejection of the Intergovernmental Agreement may force the Brighton Police Department in to a much more costly option for dispatch and communication services.
