

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRIGHTON, COLORADO, APPROVING A SINGLE SOURCE ACQUISITION FROM ECONOLITE, INC. FOR UNINTERRUPTABLE POWER SUPPLY SYSTEMS IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED EIGHTY THOUSAND AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$80,000.00) AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SIGN THE CONTRACT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY AND THE CITY CLERK ATTEST THERETO.**

**RESOLUTION NO. 2017-70**

**WHEREAS**, the effective and efficient transportation of people and goods are integral to the economic vitality of the City; and

**WHEREAS**, the City's traffic signals require uninterruptable power supply ("UPS") to provide resiliency to and protect the components of the traffic signals; and

**WHEREAS**, there are currently sixteen (16) intersections which require an UPS; and

**WHEREAS**, §3-8-10 of the Brighton Municipal Code defines "*single source procurement*" as a *contract for the procurement of material, supplies, equipment and/or services entered into after soliciting and negotiating only with one source, necessitated usually because of the technology required or the uniqueness of the material, supplies, equipment and/or services provided*; and

**WHEREAS**, there is only one battery on the market that meets the specific requirements and will fit within the traffic signal cabinets and Econolite Inc. is the vendor for the Zinc Five Battery Backup System, the only UPS with dimensions that will fit within the traffic signal cabinets; and

**WHEREAS**, the cost for the acquisition of the UPS for sixteen (16) intersections is Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000); and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council finds and determines that there is sufficient justification to approve the single source procurement for the Zinc Five Battery Backup System from Econolite, Inc. in the amount not to exceed Eighty Thousand Dollars.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRIGHTON, COLORADO, THAT:**

1. The single source acquisition for the Zinc Five Battery Backup System from Econolite, Inc. in the amount not to exceed Eighty Thousand Dollars is approved.
2. There is sufficient funding in the Project 92200 Traffic Signals account for this acquisition.
3. The Mayor is authorized to execute the Contract for and on behalf of the City; and the City Manager or his designee is authorized to take such actions and execute such additional documents as may be reasonably necessary to carry out single source acquisition.
