## Financial Results and Trends

### Governmental Fund Highlights

### Q3 Revenues (excluding transfers) totaled \$69.3M

Overall increase of \$3.4M, or 5.2%

### Q3 Spending (excluding transfers) totaled \$68.0M

Overall increase of \$11.8M, or 21.0%




### Governmental Fund Revenue Profile

## Sales Tax Revenue & Program Growth

- \$33 million in revenue due for Q2 2024, before rebates
  - Texas Roadhouse and Alberta Kuner rebates ended in 2023.
  - Currently three active sales tax rebates:
    - South Beebe, Adams East, Prairie Center
  - Use and Property Tax rebate agreements are in addition to these.
- Continued compliance efforts
  - Outreach and business education to encourage compliance.
  - Over 375 new accounts added in Q4 2024
  - More than \$880k in assessed audit revenue.


## January - September 2024 Performance By Industry

## Sales by City Area

#### Sales tax revenues up overall

- North Brighton increase due to new businesses and growth of existing businesses.
- Other city areas saw a change of less than 10%
- Sales tax from areas outside the City continues to increase.
