Observatory Park

Background/History

- Approximately 10.8 acres
- Originally called "Bromley Creek" named after the adjacent subdivision
- Built approx. 1998
- Oldest remaining playground in Brighton
- Re-named Observatory Park in 2008 as it was a popular park for the local Astronomy Club
- Outdated playground that no longer meets current standards for safety



Observatory Park

New Playground Features

- ADA Accessible Sensory Panels
- Age Inclusive Playground: 2-5 year old and 5-12 year old play structures
- Astronomy themed features
- Pour-in-place surfacing with "space" theme (constellations, etc...)
- Pour-in-place will be blue instead of black as depicted in slides to help reduce
 - surface heat
- Additional swing bay to include toddler swing
- New playground will fit into existing footprint





Observatory Park

Budget/Construction Cost

- The solicitation for a new playground was posted in mid-April for a total of 4 weeks, with a not to exceed maximum budget of \$215,000, and resulted in a total of five responses
- Of the five responses received, only one vendor provided everything requested and required to properly evaluate their proposal
- This deems Star Playgrounds as the most responsive and responsible vendor for the project.
- Sufficient appropriation exists for this project with a total project cost for install of new playground and "pour-in-place" surfacing for \$215,000
- Funding Source: Parks and Recreation Capital Projects / "Playground Replacements"
