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Funding Summary

Funding provided through by the Metropolitan Football Stadium District due to the sale of the Broncos Football Team.

Funding received by the City - \$450K

Funding Requirements

- Must be used on "Youth Activities"
- One-Time Funding
- MFSD will request updates on spending in late 2023

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27J Partnership

- Proposed allocation: \$150,000
- Asked school district what they most need
 - One-time physical education and sports equipment purchases
- Limited to schools that serve the Brighton community
- Schools did not receive monies directly



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Recreation Center Play Structure

- Proposed allocation: \$150,000
- Replace the aging (18 year old) playground for the youth area at the Recreation Center
- Install a new commercial grade childcare themed play unit
- Expanded play area with pour in place surfacing
- ADA/sensory features
- Lighter colored equipment to reduce heat and a shade component



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Youth Services

- Proposed allocation: \$50,000
- Expand Growing Grads Internship Program
- Fund Growing Grads Entrepreneur Program
- Pilot a Positive Leadership Academy for at-risk youth
- Expand mental health services during SPEAK Week



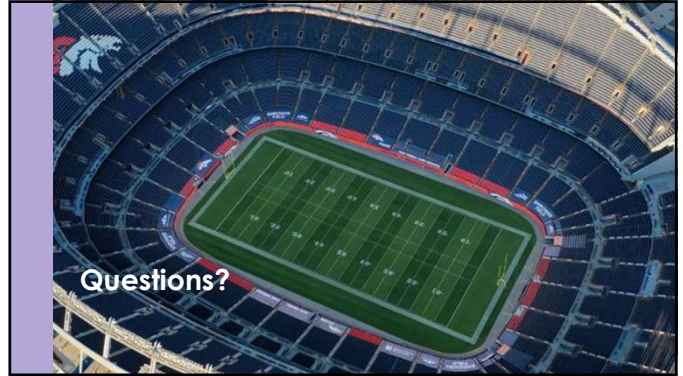
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Community Grant Program

- Proposed Allocation - \$100,000
- Targeted at non-profits serving the Brighton community
- Maximum funding of \$25K per grantee
- Funds must be used on one-time investments or purchases
- Priority given to projects that enhance services to Brighton's youth and that would not happen without the funding.
- Application process in Q1 '23



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
