About UASI Grant Program:

- City and County of Denver has been participating in this program since 2003
- The purpose of the program is to assist urban areas in efforts to build, sustain and deliver capabilities necessary to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to and recover from acts of terrorism
- Funding may also be used to enhance preparedness for other all hazards events provided the use of funds also enhances terrorism prevention, protection, preparation and response
- The purpose of this IGA is to provide for the distribution of UASI grant funds for goods and services through planning, organizing, equipping, training and exercising activities to eligible entities within the region

IGA Responsibilities: City and County of Denver

- Fiscal Agent for all purchasing and procurements of goods, services, equipment etc.
- Ensures compliance with all up to date federal guidance and local purchasing policies and procedures
- Ensures coordination among multi-jurisdictional projects and programs




IGA Responsibilities: City of Brighton

- Participate in the UASI THIRA/SPR process, Training and Exercise Planning Workshop (TEPW), and other UASI regional planning and inter-agency coordination activities
- Comply with terms of each individual grant agreement including:
 - Making equipment available for inspection and monitoring and provide maintenance records and documentation
 - Accept title and or delivery of goods at the predesignated place
 - Notify UASI staff upon receipt of goods and services
 - Repair and maintain all equipment and other tangible goods provided under this agreement in good working order for the reasonably expected life-cycle of such equipment
 - Maintain records of equipment and goods that may be required by the terms of the agreements as well as supplemental documents as requested
 - Prove a cash match if agreed to in submitted grant application
 - Complete fiscal risk assessment, if required

IGA Responsibilities: City of Brighton (cont.)

- Respond to incidents utilizing the equipment provided for or reimbursed for under this agreement, and utilizing trained personnel as requested and reasonably available
- Make equipment and personnel procured with funds from UASI grants reasonably available for training and exercise
- Make personnel trained through regionally funded Train the Trainer programs reasonably available to the region to provide training as requested
