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Rrighton Single-Family, Duplex/Multi-Unit House, and Row House Front yard: Remove minimum requirement of sod Front yard: Maximum 40% or 1,000 sq ft sod Tree lawn: Water-wise landscape (50% living cover) Back yard: Sod, water-wise landscape, non-living landscape, or native seed (any combination)



Brighton Multi-Family, Commercial, & Industrial Front: water-wise landscape or native seed Tree lawn: water-wise landscape (50% living cover) Parking: water-wise landscape or native seed Buffers: water-wise landscape or native seed

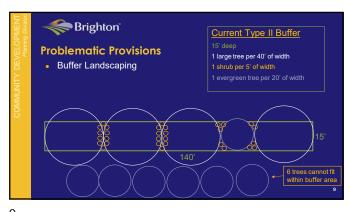

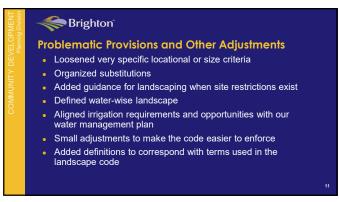
Buffer Landscaping

1 evergreen tree per 60' of width

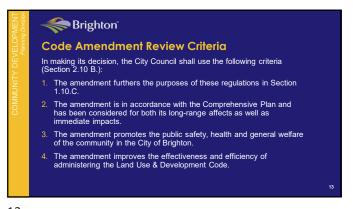
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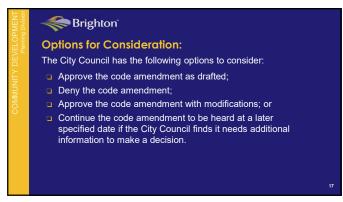
