**WHEREAS**, the residents of Brighton wish to express their continuous indebtedness and respect to our Veterans, who are found in every sector of society and serve our community in so many ways.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that I, Gregory Mills, Mayor of the City of Brighton, on behalf of the City Council, do hereby proclaim November 9 -15, 2020 as Veterans Appreciation Week and encourage all residents to join in commemoration and appreciation of our Veterans.
