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## Overview

**Purpose**

- Need to have wards redistricted prior to balloting for 2023 City Council elections based on 2020 Census
- No more than a five percent population deviation between most and least populous district

**Additional Requirements**

- Districts should be drawn as equal in population as possible
- Districts should be compact
- Districts should be contiguous
- Districts should not be done via political gerrymandering and should maintain racial equality among districts
- Preservation of communities of interest

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
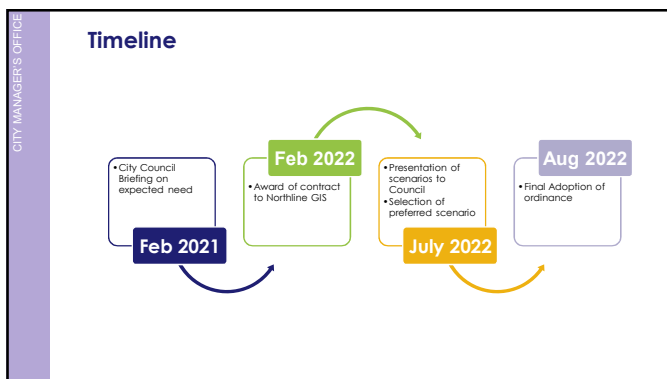
## Overview

**Additional Considerations**

- Maintain neighborhood connections
- Consideration of current and future growth
- Locations of current Council and Planning Commission Members
- General election precincts

**Current Distributions**

- Ward 1: 10,965
- Ward 2: 10,515
- Ward 3: 9,368
- Ward 4: 9,239


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## Scenario 1

Ward Populations:

- 10,298
- 10,143
- 9,836
- 9,810

Difference in population from largest (Ward 1) to smallest (Ward 3): 4.8%




**Scenario 2**

Ward Populations:


- 10,219
- 10,173
- 9,848
- 9,847

Difference in population from largest (Ward 1) to smallest (Ward 3): 3.7%
