#### Background

- What is a Comprehensive Plan?
  - Required by the Colorado Revised Statutes 30-28-106
    - A duty of the Planning Commission of any county or home rule municipality
    - Provides a guide to land development decisions
    - Advisory in nature unless made binding by zoning, platting, or other land use decision.
    - Outlines numerous categories for plan topics, which are meant to take a "comprehensive" look at planning the area.

### Brighton's Share of NE Metro Sales Tax

To increase Brighton's share of sales tax collected within the Market Area


- No data source available for the NE Metro Area
- Alternative option.
  - Compare Brighton totals with other municipalities
  - Cannot expect to observe a majority share
  - Needs a comprehensive plan amendment



## Core Area ! Connectivity

To increase the miles of trails, bike lanes and sidewalks built in the core area.

- Sidewalks 159,923 LF, 30.29 Miles
- Estimated 65-75% error in this data
  - Significant work needs to occur to establish a better baseline for the data
