Purpose / Background

- City Council shall review and make a decision on the proposed IGA.
- Staff will summarize the existing and draft Fort Lupton IGA.
- In March of 2009, the City of Brighton and the City of Fort Lupton entered into an IGA.
- Both parties are looking for a new IGA that is simple to interpret and execute.



- Established a growth boundary line generally following Weld County Road (WCR) 6.
- With a term of ten years, it is set to expire on March 10, 2019.
- A few other notable inclusions in this 2009 IGA were provisions discussing cooperation between the two communities and annexation language.
- Within this IGA, WCR 6 is still generally the boundary line though there are a few areas where the cities agreed to allow each other to cross WCR 6, mostly due to existing annexed areas or existing agreements.




Staff has some recommendations for the new IGA:

• WCR 6 shall remain as the boundary line, except for land areas that have already been annexed by either City.

- > Currently, Brighton is the only city to have crossed WCR 6.
- Staff recommends that WCR 6 be an adaptive boundary, such that should either city want to cross WCR 6 in the future, they would need to seek permission from the other city.
- Staff is recommending that language be included setting for the referral of development proposals for both communities along WCR 6.

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
Growth Boundary Line

Planning Areas






Additional recommendations for the new IGA:

- Both cities are to work together on utility, transportation, and recreational planning efforts for the area.
- o Each has agreed on a ten-year term.
- This agreement does not seek to interfere with Fort Lupton's IGA with Todd Creek Village North for wastewater treatment.



 <u>Additional</u> <u>recommendation:</u>

> The annexation of the parcels known as the Perry Pit to Fort Lupton will not be contested if the purpose is for water storage.

Public Notice

• Notice of the proposed IGA was published in the *Brighton Standard Blade* on February 27, 2019.



Staff Recommendation

- The intent of this IGA is to:
 - Work together on items such as transportation, utility service, recreation, and land use for the designated planning areas,
 - Prevent an "annexation war", and
 - Seek to make the planning areas successful, thus forming a strong regional relationship and partnership between the two cities.

Staff recommends approval of the renewal of a revised IGA between Fort Lupton and Brighton.



City Council Options

<u>City Council has the following four options, to:</u>

- Approve the IGA via Resolution as drafted,
- Approve the IGA via Resolution with any changes deemed necessary,
- Deny the IGA via Resolution, or
- Continue the item to be heard at a later date.
