\$1.2M in ongoing operating costs for 3 new buildings




New Budget & Innovation Department

\$330K in Donations Planned





Lodging Tax Usage Resolution

- Allows the city to utilize \$250K of Lodging Tax Fund reserves on the move of the Brighton City Museum from Historic City Hall to the Historic 1886 Church
- Brighton Urban Renewal Authority Board approved a matching \$250K
- Allows the museum to be more accessible to the public
- Supports Brighton's downtown

Mill Levy Resolution

- Must set mill levy annually
- Property tax collected by Adams
 County and Weld County on behalf
 of the City
- Mill Levy fixed at 6.65 over last two decades
- 2026 mill levy is projected to result in \$6,247,287 in revenues for the 2026 Budget



2026 Fee Resolution Changes

Addition of Micro Transit fees

Building Fees updated to clarify fees and increased based on inflation

Removed fees no longer being charged

- Group Home
- Officer Subpoena

Addition of \$60 Probation Class Fee

Updated Utility and impact fee rates with feedback from August presentation







2026 Fee Resolution - Micro Transit Program

\$2.00/Ride for the primary rider

- A guest accompanying the primary rider: \$1.00
- A caregiver accompanying the primary rider:
 Free

The following groups will be offered a discount as detailed below:

- Seniors aged 65 and older: \$1.00/Ride
- Teenagers under the age of 18: \$1.00/Ride
- Veterans: \$1.00/Ride

2026 Fee Resolution – Building Division

Language Clarification

- "Miscellaneous valuation" updated to "permit valuation"
- Clarification of chief building official's opinion
- "All permits" to "Permits that require a review"

Inflationary Increases

- Permit review fee (\$180 \$189)
- Residential Housing Electrical Inspection (\$120 \$126)

Addition of:

- Foundation Only Permit (Commercial): \$600
- Temporary Certificate of Occupancy (Commercial): \$200; \$100 for every 30-day renewal
- Demo Permit for Structure: \$100
- Demo Permit for Interior: \$50
- Dumpster Permit Fee: \$50
- Retro Permit Fee (Approved Emergency): Standard, Use \$0 with receipt
- Retro Permit Fee: Double the permit fee/Use Tax \$0

2026 Fee Resolution – Utility Rates

Original Proposal

- Water 7%
- Wastewater Metro 8%
- Wastewater Lochbuie match Metro
- Storm Drainage increase \$3/EQR

Revised Proposal

- Water 7%
- Wastewater Metro 8%
- Wastewater Lochbuie 0%*
- Storm Drainage increase \$3/EQR

* The updated rate proposal incorporates Council's feedback and reaffirms our process of passing through wastewater rates imposed by our processors. As the Lochbuie Sewer Board has not completed its rate study and no rate changes have been proposed or approved, the City staff will not propose any rate changes for Lochbuie customers.
