2024 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program (JAG)

- Offered through the Department of Justice Bureau of Justice Assistance

The Office of Justice Programs is committed to advancing work that promotes civil rights and racial equity, increases access to justice, supports crime victims and individuals impacted by the justice system, strengthens community safety and protects the public from crime and evolving threats, and builds trust between law enforcement and the community.

Awarded \$12,576 for purchase of Flock Safety LPR Cameras

Focused on identification and apprehension of stolen vehicles or persons with warrants.

This system has been proven to increase solvability of crimes by 10%. Case Study January 2024



Flock Safety

“An indispensable tool for modern law enforcement, this state-of-the-art license plate recognition (LPR) camera doesn’t just capture license plates – it’s redefining the entire landscape of public safety.”

Real-time information for stolen vehicles, stolen license plates, associated warrants.

Officers would get the alert about a possible stolen vehicle and attempt to locate it. Some businesses in Brighton currently use Flock Safety Cameras.



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Flock Safety

7 Falcon fixed cameras and 1 mobile

Working with CDOT for permitting and Flock will do install

Awarded Dec 4th, 2024 pending City approval and acceptance

Financial Impact

-Total cost will be split between grant and forfeiture funds

\$12,576 from Grant

\$13,473.99 Forfeiture fund

-Yearly cost of subscription fees
